<p>The Montana Land Information 2019/2020 Plan was published for a 30-day public comment period on 10/1/2018. Please see the attached public comment received by the Montana State Library.</p> <p>In 2017, the Council made the decision to develop multi-year land plan that could be updated/refreshed annually to fulfill the requirements of the Montana Land Information Act: MCA 90-1-404. Therefore, the Montana Land Information 2019/2020 Plan will have minimal changes or updates. I'd like to grants to local governments focus on actual products and less on their internal infrastructure development.
