Would you like to learn who you might connect with as mentors and coaches for teens? Would you like to learn how teens would like to help their community grow? Be as specific as possible.</i>

<p>What impact should this CL work with youth and community achieve? <i>For example, Teens have opportunities to develop relationships with peers and adults. Teens gain social emotional skills.</i></p>	
<p>How will you make sure teens that may not be traditional library users are engaged in the CL work of the library and the community?</p>	
<p>What conversations do you need to have with staff, colleagues, administrators and community members to achieve buy-in and support in and for this work?</p>
