# A RESOLUTION TO CREATE AND REAFFIRM A FREE PUBLIC LIBRARY

## Resolution 98 - 4

The Blaine County Commissioners were notified by Lee Kuhr, the Director of the Blaine County Library, by correspondence dated May 12, 1998, that the legal status of the public libraries in Montana was a matter of some concern as the result of a recent Montana Supreme Court decision regarding the three public libraries in Teton County, Montana.

The Blaine County Commissioners researched the matter of the creation of the Blaine County Library, but it cannot be determined from the record whether or not the library was properly established.

Montana law, at section 22-1-303, MCA, allows a public library to be established in any county by the governing body passing and entering upon its minutes a resolution to the effect that a free public library be established pursuant to the provisions of law relating to public libraries.


It is the intent of the Blaine County Commissioners to pass this resolution to address and correct any possible dispute or concern regarding the proper creation of the public library, and to reaffirm the library's historic existence in Blaine County.

## RESOLUTION

IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED by the Blaine County Commissioners, relative to the above described matter, that passage of a resolution pursuant to section 22-1-303, and the creation of a public library under the provisions of 22-1-303 through 22-1-317, is in the best interest of the people of Blaine County, which determination has been based on a full disclosure of all pertinent information and an examination of the records of Blaine County, Montana. Accordingly, having adopted the foregoing resolution, the Blaine County Commissioners hereby reaffirm the creation in Blaine County of a public library providing library services to the people of the County.



This conveyance is made with the condition that the said real estate be forever used by the said party of the second part for a public Library and be controled by a board of trustees according to the laws of the State of Montana.

TOGETHER, with all and singular the hereinbefore described premises together with all tenements, hereditaments, and appurtenances thereto belonging or in anywise appertaining, and the reversion and reversions, remainder and remainders, rents, issues and profits thereof; and also all the estate, right, title, interest, right of dower and right of homestead, possession, claim, and demand whatsoever, as well in law as in equity, of the said part y. of the FIRST PART, of, in or to the said premises, and every part and parcel thereof, with the appurtenances thereto belonging; TO HAVE AND TO HOLD, all and singular the above mentioned and described premises unto the said part y. of the SECOND PART, and to his heirs and assigns forever.

And the said part y. of the FIRST PART, and his heirs, do hereby covenant that he will forever WARRANT AND DEFEND all right, title and interest in and to the said premises and the quiet and peaceable possession thereof, unto the said part y. of the SECOND PART, his heirs and assigns, against the acts and deeds of the said part y. of the FIRST PART, and all and every person and persons whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same.

By virtue and in pursuance of the authority vested in the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Blaine, State of Montana, we, John W. Acher, James Claridge and F. B. Polley, the duly elected, qualified and acting Commissioners of the county of Blaine, State of Montana, and as such constitute the Board of County Commissioners of said County, do hereby proclaim that on Tuesday, the 2nd day of September, 1919, there will be held in the several election precincts of Blaine County, State of Montana, special election of the electors of said County, to submit to said electors the question of whether or not the County of Blaine, State of Montana, shall incur an indebtedness to the amount of One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) for the purpose of purchasing seed grain to be furnished and supplied by the County to inhabitants of the County who are engaged in the occupation of farming, and who are financially unable to procure such seed grain and who require such seed grain in order to enable them to plant and sow crops at the next ensuing planting season.

The polls at said election will be open at eight o'clock in the morning and will continue open until six o'clock in the afternoon of the same day.

Special ballots will be furnished for voting upon the above proposition.

June 6th, 1921, Regular Session:-

The Board of County Commissioners met this day in regular session at 10:00 o'clock A.M., present, Chairman Jas. Claridge, Commissioners F. B. Polley and W. Lee Sedgwick and the County Clerk.

The minutes of the last session were read and approved.

The Board ordered One hundred twenty five (\$125.00) transferred from the County General Fund to the State Examiners Fund.

Geo. Fuller, Glenn A. German and Ort Irons appeared before the Board for the purpose of considering the status of State Highway matters as to finances. The matter was discussed and action deferred.

Board adjourned at 12:00 o'clock noon till 1:30 P.M. same day.

June 6, 1921, 1:30 P.M., Board reassembled at this time with all members of the Board present and the Clerk.

Jas. Thurlow appeared before the Board protesting against the charges in the sum of \$13.00 charges against the land of Bernhard Pankratz for poisoning gophers, on the ground that he (Thurlow) had completed the poisoning prior to the act of the exterminator.

The Board ordered Nine and 29/100 (\$9.29) Dollars transferred from the institute fund to the County General Fund.

Board took up the work of auditing claims against the county.

Board adjourned at 12:00 o'clock noon till 1:00 o'clock same day.

June 7, 1921, 1:00 o'clock P.M.

Board reassembled at this time with all members of the Board present and the Clerk.

Representatives of the State Highway Commission and the Federal Government appeared before the Board and State Highway finance matters were discussed. And the Board hereby orders that all members of the Board of County Commissioners would leave for Helena, Montana, Friday, June 10, 1921, for the purpose of interviewing the State Highway Commission relative to finances in connection with State and Federal Road construction.

H. J. Lehfeldt appeared before the Board protesting against assessment of expense for poisoning gophers on land of The Lehfeldt Co. in district of H. I. Richmond.

Danile Weidner appeared before the Board protesting against assessment of expense for poisoning gophers on lands of William Weidner. The Board ordered the matter would be taken under consideration.

The Board hereby appoints Miss Patience Kamps as Librarian at the Carnegie County Library for a period of twelve months, beginning Sept. 1, 1921, at a salary of Fifteen hundred (\$1500.00) Dollars per year. The contract was signed by the Board and ordered forwarded to the appointee for her signature.

Board adjourned at 5:00 o'clock P.M. till 9:00 o'clock A.M. June 8, 1921.

June 8, 1921, 9:00 A. M.

Board reassembled at this time, present Chairman Jas. Claridge, Commissioner F.B. Polley and the County Clerk.

Board continued to audit claims against the county.

Commissioner Sedgwick arrived and took his seat with the Board.

W. W. Sheetz appeared protesting against the assessment of expense for poisoning gophers on his land.

Board adjourned at 12:00 o'clock noon till 1:00 o'clock P. M. same day.

June 8, 1921, 1:00 o'clock P.M.

Board reassembled at this time with all members of the Board present and the Clerk.

Mr. Dorreen of the State Highway Commission met with the Board and State Highway matters were considered.

Contract of Philip Harder, Superintendent of the County Poor Farm, was signed by the Board and ordered filed.

Board continued to audit claims against the county.

Justice report of Andrew Moore for term ending May 30, 1921, was approved.

County Clerks monthly report for the months of April and May were examined and approved.

County Treasurers monthly report for the month of April was examined and approved.

County Treasurers quarterly report for the quarter ending May 31, 1921, was examined and approved.

J. K. Laporte appeared before the Board protesting against assessment of charges for poisoning gophers by George Kappes on his land.

Appointment of Jas. McCoy as Special Deputy Sheriff was approved.

The following resolution was offered by Commissioner Polley and motion made that the resolution be adopted, to-wit;

WHEREAS, It is the opinion of the Board of County Commissioners that there is very little work being done on the county roads of the county and very little work to be done by the County Surveyor of the County, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that it is not necessary that the County Engineer be employed on full time and that such official be allowed fifteen days work each month and any work done by such official for the county be done under direction of the County Board.

Seconded by Commissioner Sedgwick that resolution be adopted. Motion put to a vote and resulted in the following; those voting, yea, Commissioner Polley, Sedgwick and Claridge. Nay, none. Motion declared carried and resolution adopted.

Appointments of Ed. Blackwood and Joseph Mosser as special Deputy Sheriffs were approved.

The Clerk was instructed to notify A. Ellis Inc. of Harlem, that the county would not furnish Mrs. Nancy A. Rusk with any further assistance.

The Board hereby orders that all grain held by the county be sold.

The Board hereby directs the Clerk to notify Reed-Ekegren & Co. to appear before the Board on the 18th day of June, 1921, for the purpose of making final settlement on seed grain. also, notify W. W. Harvey to appear at the same time for the same purpose.

of the county and is hereby authorized to execute such legal papers in behalf of the county.

County Clerk's monthly reports for the months of July and August, 1921, were examined and approved.

Board adjourned at 4:30 o'clock till the following day.
