The Blaine County Library Board of Trustees met at the Commissioners room of the Court House on Feb. 5 at 7 P.M.

Present: John Stephens, Eleanor Felton, Mabel Egeland, Julia Graham, Eleanor Harmon and librarians Leona Jensen and Dorothy Brower.

Since the Civic Center Building at Harlem had burned completely and the Harlem Library contained therein had been totally destroyed a state of emergency was proclaimed and a mill levy of \$3000.00 was to be levied on next years library budget to purchase necessary supplies and equipment to refurnish the Harlem Library and to provide rent for new quarters. Temporary quarters are to be at the Buckley Bldg. The rent was set at \$80. Books and labor are to be solicited to make a new start. Projected plans for the future are to be taken up at later meetings. Mrs. Brower, librarian and Mr. Stephens are looking at possible locations on a more permanent basis.
